Pray for Healing

God is a God who heals. God says in Exodus 15:26, “I am the Lord who heals you.” There are many examples of healing in the Old Testament. For example, Naaman, the commander of the army of the king of Aram, was miraculously healed by God of leprosy. (2 Kings chapter 5)

Jesus preached that the *Kingdom of God* is at hand and called his followers to repent and believe the Good News. (Mark 1:14) A defining characteristic of this *Kingdom of God* that Jesus proclaimed and inaugurated was healing: healing of body, mind and spirit. The Gospels narrate 26 specific healing miracles of Jesus. And Jesus was clear in his teaching that this healing ministry was not just his personal gift to the world, but was meant to be a gift exercised by all his followers. Jesus’ commission at the end of Mark’s Gospel reads in part, “Go into all the world and proclaim the good news to the whole creation... And these signs will accompany those who believe: by using my name... they will lay their hands on the sick, and they will recover.” (Mark 16:15-18 *condensed*)

Healing prayer was a normal activity of the early church, and we believe that it has been part of the life

of the Church in every generation.

Praying for healing has always been an important part of our ministry. People everywhere need healing of body, mind and spirit. Over time we have learned several important things about healing prayer:

1. God heals for a purpose. God healed Fr. Steve’s stammer, (at least in part) because he needed a teacher and later a preacher. God always has some purpose in mind for the ones who receive physical healing.
2. Anyone and everyone can pray for or receive prayer for healing. We are particularly touched when children come for prayer, and thrilled when they initiate prayer for healing.
3. God works with and through the doctors, nurses and other medical professionals (including psychologists and psychiatrists) to bring about healing. We have found that medical professionals are often very open to healing prayer.
4. The gifts of the Holy Spirit need to be tested to discern that it is indeed God who is acting. Good discernment criteria are the Great Commandments (Matthew 22:37-40) and the “Fruit of the Spirit.” (Galatians 5:22).

One of the most frequently asked questions with regard to healing prayer is HOW to pray for healing. A great resource for answering this question is a chapter in the book *Questions of Life* by Nicky Gumbel. He teaches this simple process that invites God into a situation to bring His healing presence:

1. Begin by asking, “Where does it hurt? What do you want us to pray for?”
2. Think about why the person has this condition. Sometimes it is very obvious, like a leg hurt in a car crash. But it is also very important to listen to the person. There may be another spiritual condition – fear, a need to forgive or to receive forgiveness.
3. Then offer a short prayer, following the models in the New Testament. We pray in the name of Jesus; we ask the Holy Spirit to come; we lay hands on the person; sometimes we anoint them with oil.
4. After you are finished praying you may want to ask, “How are you feeling?” Sometimes a healing may take place right away – sometimes it may take place gradually. Even with Jesus! One time Jesus laid hands on a blind man and prayed for him. Then he asked him if he could see. The man said, “I see people but they look like trees walking around.” So Jesus laid hands on him

again and prayed. This time the man eyes were open, his sight was restored and he could see clearly. (Mark 8:23-25)

5. Reassure the person of God’s love, whether they’ve received healing or not. It’s important to give them the liberty to come back. You can be prayed for over and over and over again. We need to avoid putting burdens on people – suggesting it’s their lack of faith that stopped them from being healed. Jesus never said to anybody that it was their lack of faith that prevented them from being healed. Sometimes Jesus said to his disciples that they lacked faith, but never to the person who was sick. We need to go on praying and we need to ensure that the lives of the people we are praying for are rooted in the healing community of the church where long term healing takes place.

Our vision is that Holy Trinity increasingly become a community of healing prayer. This month we will be blessed with an opportunity to enter more deeply into healing prayer through the ministry of Pastor Sharon Lewis. Come and learn. Come and receive prayer for healing. Know that God loves you and wants you to be as healthy as you can possibly be. One of the ways to accomplish this is healing prayer.
