### Come, Holy Spirit Come!

*Come Holy Spirit, come. Come as the Fire of Love and burn in our hearts. Come as the Wind and cleanse our souls. Help us see our need of you. Help us turn to you and make us holy. For our greater good and your greater glory, in Jesus' name we pray. Amen.*

We have prayed that prayer almost every time we have preached for about twenty years now. It is our interpretation of an ancient prayer for catechumens, adults about to be baptized at the Easter Vigil. Of course this prayer is based on Acts chapter two. This is the story of Pentecost, the beginning of the Christian church. The Wind of God blows and fills the house with God's presence and then everyone is speaking of God's power. The fire of God comes and a flame rests on each believer; this is a sign that the fire of God is in each person.... And the amazing thing is that they are all able to understand each other, even though they speak different languages.

We pray that prayer all the time, because we believe this still happens. We believe that when we ask, the Holy Spirit comes. Sometimes there are dramatic manifestations of the Spirit, but always, always, when God's Word is preached and Jesus is proclaimed, and the Holy Spirit is invited, we expect that the Holy Spirit will come. The many ways we have seen the Holy Spirit come fall into three main categories.

First, when we invite the Holy Spirit to come, we see how people begin to understand themselves as having a place in the Kingdom of God. This really begins with birth. Whenever we hold a baby we have this powerful sense that every one of us comes from God. Every child is created by God. But the other end of life speaks

this same truth. Just as every one of us comes from God, every one of us returns to God. For in the power of the Holy Spirit, God is revealed to us as the Alpha and the Omega, the beginning and the end. And there is in this a holy comfort. Certainly there is joy when you hold a baby, but there is also powerful spiritual comfort in the face of death. The Holy Spirit comes so that people understand that they have a place in God's Kingdom now and for all of eternity.

The second way we see the Holy Spirit come is that people are healed so that they are able to do God's work. You might remember us talking about our favorite prayer for healing. We learned it from Canon Jim Holbeck of Sydney, Australia. It goes like this, "Lord, heal me for your sake that I might do your work to your glory for the rest of my life." We have seen many healings that are the result of the Holy Spirit working to help the disciples of Jesus to do what God needs them to do. Many people come to church and here they find a ministry to which God is calling them. And maybe they have pain in their back, or maybe they have been depressed for a long time, or maybe the person cannot walk very well or see very well. Maybe the person is afraid to speak in public. And in the power of the Holy Spirit we see God's people doing what they did not believe they could do, because they do it for God and

for the love of his people. This is the power of the Holy Spirit.

Thirdly the Holy Spirit comes to revive the church through special times of re-dedication and retreat. When we reflect back on the last twenty years of asking the Holy Spirit to come, we remember especially the power of the Holy Spirit showing up at Faith Alive Weekends, Women's Retreats, Men's Retreats, Cursillo Weekends, New Beginnings weekends for teenagers, and Alpha Weekends, etc. Of course people felt inspired on these weekends and there was some great teaching, but what stands out the most in terms of the work of the Holy Spirit is the way that people worked together.

It says in First Corinthians that, "To each is given the manifestation of the Spirit for the Common Good." On every renewal weekend or retreat we have helped lead, it's been hard to see just how it could all come together. But the Holy Spirit has used the limitations of the various participants to make sure that everyone had a part in pulling it all together for God's glory and the teaching of his people.

This third movement of the Holy Spirit is really the glue that holds the church together... the manifestation of the Spirit for the Common Good. If you notice in Acts chapter two, the people do not all speak the same language, but somehow they all manage to hear each other so that God's deeds of Power in Jesus Christ are proclaimed. This is the miracle

of the church every day. People in this church come from very different places such that without the Holy Spirit it is impossible for us to hear and understand each other. There are Democrats and Republicans and those who love traditional music and those who love contemporary music and Southerners and Yankees and liberals and conservatives and baby boomers and baby busters, etc. But the Holy Spirit helps us to get beyond all that so that we can really "hear" each other... so that the individual gifts of each person can be called out to build up this church. It is the Holy Spirit that makes it possible for us to work together.

The Holy Spirit comes so that we might have a whole and holy life. At the very beginning of the Bible, in Genesis chapter one it says that the Wind of God, the Spirit of God, swept over the earth, to begin God's creative process for the Universe. Today let the Wind of God sweep over you to re-create your life, so that you clearly understand your place in God's eternity, so that you are healed to the fullest extent possible to do God's work... and so that you learn to live with all those who are different from you... and yet are meant to be your brothers and sisters in Christ. Come Holy Spirit, come. Make us holy; make us whole.

### Caring Ministry: A Way of Life

Christian caregiving has its roots in John 13:34-35 where Jesus summarized discipleship: "A new commandment I give you: love one another; even as I have loved you, that you also love one another. If you have love for one another, then all will know you are my disciple." This is the love from God to his people. Grace is implied in this love. It is love without any kind judgment or conditions placed on the object of the love.

Some time ago I had read this statement, I am not sure where, but it really made an impact with me. *Three billion people on the face of the earth go to bed hungry every night, but, four billion people go to bed every night hungry for a simple word of encouragement and recognition.*

Christian caregiving is done out of love, a love that comes from our relationship with God, and as a response to God's love, it focuses on the other person's needs.

Did you know that being a healing influence to others is not as complicated as it seems? Did you know that the most healing thing we can bring to people is just our presence? It is said that 80% of our communication is nonverbal. This means we can communicate a lot of love and care to another person without

even having to say a word. Showing up is what counts.

I think the greatest thing you can ever give someone else is your attention and just listening. It is your presence that counts.

Remember, God is always present, no matter where you are or what situation you are in.

Let God's healing power work through you. And remember -- you are more than capable of being a healing presence to each other. That's how God made you. There are quite a few who we know, who need healing and

need to be showered with the abundance of God's comfort and love.

## Cursillo at Holy Trinity

### A SHORT COURSE IN CHRISTIAN LIVING

Cursillo starts with identifying those who are living an active Christian Life and witnessing to their love of Christ and who would welcome the support of the Cursillo community and method. Is this you? Cursillo – Spanish for “Christian living”, not Christian doctrine or theology.

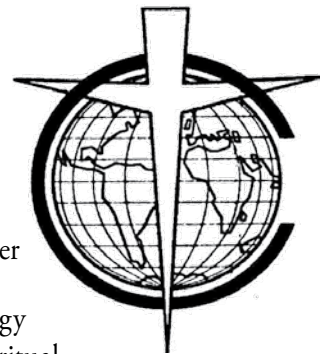
Begun in Spain in the 1940’s as a Christian renewal movement within the Church, Cursillo de Cristiandad is a method that provides an ongoing structure and community of support and accountability to help individual Christians to live out the life that Jesus promised and to

share the Gospel in their everyday environments. Its basis is the small group reunion, a weekly meeting of a few friends to share recent experiences of their Christian walks. This meeting, which needn’t last more than an hour, encourages its members to press on in their Christian lives. Once a month there is an Ultreya, a gathering of the small groups for a broader base of sharing and support.

The kickoff 3-Day Weekend is a time to focus on the fundamentals of being a Christian and to learn the Cursillo method. A group of Episcopalians gathers to share the richness of worship and to

broaden each one’s appreciation of the Church. Planned and conducted by a team of laity together with two or three members of the clergy who function as spiritual advisors, it consists of a series of talks emphasizing the doctrine of Grace, the Sacraments, and the Cursillo foundations: Piety, Study, and Action.

The Eucharist is celebrated daily along with the daily offices, and time is provided for prayer, confession and spiritual direction. And, of course, there is fellowship, singing and good food. There are no secrets, but there are some joyful surprises. The next Cursillo Weekend



is coed, to be held October 7-10, 2010.

The 4th Day is the rest of your life, and it represents a lifetime of living out your Baptismal Covenant with the support of the Cursillo method and community.
