## Building for the Future: Capital Campaign Update

It is truly a joy to announce the fulfillment of prayers. On September 13, 2009, Holy Trinity will dedicate Pearson Hall in a service of blessing immediately following the 9 o'clock service. The Vestry has named the music room on the first floor, the Lou West Music Room, and it will be dedicated at a later date when the stained glass window which will adorn that room is finished.

This accomplishment in Christ comes after at least a decade of planning. In the spring of 1999 members of the worship committee visited many churches in the region and noted their recommendations for Holy Trinity. The final report includes observations on the proximity of the nursery to the worship space, the accessibility of communion, space made available for different kinds of music and the effectiveness of sound and lighting systems. The efforts of this and many other planning groups led to the launch of the "Step Out in Faith" Capital Campaign in 2002.

By the time we arrived in 2006, "Step Out in Faith" was successfully on track to raise a total of about 2 million dollars. Lewis Hall (our administrative offices and youth rooms) had been acquired and remodeled. Some remodeling had occurred in the church and parish hall. About \$800,000 remained of the \$2 million. In 2007, after much debate in the Vestry, a decision was reached to tithe 10% of the original receipts to Outreach. This commitment was fulfilled by allocating a total of \$200,000 for the following outreach efforts of the church: (1) Holy Trinity Episcopal Academy \$100,000; (2) Camp Wingmann for the renovation of a cabin \$55,000; and (3) the establishment of a parish Youth Scholarship Fund \$45,000, to be

administered by the Co-Rectors for kids who need financial help to go to camp or to participate in other children's or youth activities associated with the church.

After the Outreach Tithe, there was about \$600,000 left for new construction. The original campaign had called for the building of a parish center, which would have involved demolishing the area that is now the nursery, gallery, parish hall and kitchen – and in its place erecting a two story building with offices, a nursery, meeting rooms and choir rooms. To accomplish this, the "Step Out in Faith" Capital Campaign would have needed to raise at least twice as much money as it did. Since we knew that we could not do exactly what had been hoped-for, the effort since 2007 has been to accomplish as many of the goals of the campaign as possible.

In the spring of 2008, under the leadership of Bob Riley and Jim Pearson, plans were drawn up to build a "movable wall" between the East and West Living Rooms in the Parish Hall. This was in keeping with the original Capital Campaign goal that "sliding walls will divide the fellowship hall... for Christian education, choir practice, workshops, guild meetings, and other parish functions." In May 2008 the Vestry approved a contract for this and the construction was completed in October 2008.

Also in the spring and summer of 2008, plans were drawn up to renovate what had been the choir room and earlier in Holy Trinity's history, the parish offices, into a beautiful new nursery. Contracts were signed and construction completed so that the nursery was available in the fall of 2008. This too was a goal of the original campaign which envisioned a "nursery to encourage young families to participate fully in the life of the parish."

The choirs were most gracious in giving up their practice space for the new

nursery and were also very active in helping to plan for the new building, designed on its first floor to provide what had been envisioned in 2002, "a choir room that recognizes the important contributions of many fine musicians to our spiritual and temporal lives and assists them in their mission." In addition, when the groundbreaking occurred for the new building on March 22, 2009, a second floor with four Sunday School classrooms was planned to continue growing our children's ministry at Holy Trinity.

In 2008 and 2009, former Senior Warden, Jim Pearson gave countless hours to planning and supervising the construction of the parish hall dividers, the new nursery and the new choir and Sunday school building. He was often at the church early and late to make sure that countless details were addressed. In July of 2009 he traveled to Georgia for a well deserved break from this volunteer work and on July 8, 2009, we received news of his unexpected death while working at his Georgia cabin. At the Vestry meeting a few days later it was a unanimous vote to name the new building Pearson Hall.

We expect that when the final bills are paid that the Parish will have spent about \$430,000 to build Pearson Hall. We hope that there will be about \$170,000 remaining in Capital Campaign funds to do some remodeling in the sanctuary and in the rooms that were used for choir changing rooms (making a bride's room). Our first priority is to make our sanctuary area more accessible to those with limited mobility.

Two adult forums were held on August 16 and 23, 2009 to begin to gather input on the Sanctuary remodeling, which we anticipate might happen in June 2010. There are limits on what can be done based on the structure of the steel building that comprises

our church. The choir area is on a concrete slab, hollowed-out underneath for an air-conditioning tunnel. When we bring down the altar rail in front of the current choir area, we would like to open up the choir area by eliminating the hallways now used for returning from communion. We are, however, somewhat limited by the steel beams that hold up the ceilings in those hallways. Within the limits of the concrete and steel we believe that much can be done.

As your rectors we do not want to move the high altar. This may seem odd to some, since Episcopal priests have been lobbying to move altars "out from the wall" since the deliberations of Vatican II over 40 years ago. The truth is that this is such an old debate that neither of us had ever celebrated Holy Eucharist by turning towards a high altar (with our backs to the people) until we came to Holy Trinity (after being ordained for 14 years). What we have found, however, in our

experience here is that there is a rich symbolic power to the old tradition. When the priest turns toward the altar facing the same direction as the people, then priest and people together turn their souls towards God, and for us this speaks of the transcendence of God. Sometimes that is very helpful, particularly if you imagine yourself offering all your sins to God on the high altar. This is not to say that we don't like to face you when we celebrate Eucharist; in that case we celebrate that God is in the midst of us, immanent with us. As Episcopalians we want the "both-and" in the possibilities for worship at Holy Trinity. So our preference is to keep both altars, although we would like to be able to move the portable altar to the side when celebrating at the high altar.

There will be many more discussions, drawings and cost estimates as we move forward with plans for remodeling the sanctuary. But this

month let us pause to celebrate the answer to prayer. God's people at Holy Trinity "stepped out in faith" and embraced a spiritual vision for the expansion of ministry in their church. Much of that vision is now manifest in the physical world. We can see the nursery. We can see the dividers in the parish hall. Soon we will see the choirs practicing in the Lou West Music Room and the children learning their Bible in the classrooms of Pearson Hall. In the words of the Prayer Book, "Let the whole world see and know that things which were cast down are being raised up, and things which had grown old are being made new, and that all things are being brought to their perfection by him through whom all things were made, Jesus Christ our Lord." BCP p. 528

## Library Matters

### Donations

Two Bags Full! The Library received two brown bags full of books. Thanks to the Anonymous Donors. Your books will be available in the Library in the Narthex:

Listed below are just a few:

*Starting Your Day Right: Devotions for Each Morning of the Year* by Joyce Meyer. Brief devotionals with selected Bible verses. As with all her books, you can hear Joyce Meyer's voice as you read these little devotions.

*May You Always Have an Angel by Your Side* edited by Douglas Pagels. This is from the Blue Mountain Arts collection, and what a gem of a book it is! Snippets of spiritual thoughts about angels in writings from more than 100 authors.

*The Servant Church: Diaconal Ministry and the Episcopal Church* by John E. Booty. This is a study of the Church with special section about the history and role of Deacons. The chapters about the Church in the present day are dated (1968) but the chapters on history are very informative and readable.

*A Manual for Eucharistic Visitors* by Beth Wickenberg Ely. A guidebook for Eucharistic visitors with practical suggestions for carrying out this important ministry.

*He Gave Us Stories: the Bible Student's Guide to Interpreting Old Testament Narratives* by Richard Pratt. This book is a systematic approach to the study of Old Testament narrative. He advocates that the teacher or facilitator of an Old Testament Bible Study should prepare, apply and investigate these stories. He describes the various ways one should approach narrative structure and character. The book is sprinkled with diagrams illustrating the many ways one can approach the many aspects of the Old Testament.

### New Books

*Life with God* by Richard Foster. Through the Old and New Testament, God said "I am with you – will you be with me?" Life with God is not the usual Bible study.

Use the Bible for spiritual growth and read it with a new understanding. Let it transform you completely. What is needed for discipleship? Do you want a deeper connection to God? Examples are given about New and Old Testament people living with God and dedicating their lives to God. Disciplines for our inner life are a strong foundation of our outer life. Charts in the back of the book

are helpful in understanding the Bible as a transforming book.

*Knowing Christ Today* by Dallas Willard. Can we trust spiritual knowledge? Faith and reason not just opposing ideas. Is Christianity just a myth or even a fraud? We know Christ has had a real historical effect for centuries. Is there a disappearance of moral knowledge? Jesus was known for his moral teaching. In the past, knowing right from wrong; however, morality and moral values changed to feelings and traditions. Today, we are not clear what one constitutes morality. *Knowing Christ Today* also includes chapters on miracles and pluralism. This book contains discussion questions, an index and scriptural references.

*Tapestry of Christian Theology: Modern Minds on the Biblical Narrative* by Gregory Higgins. Designed as a text for students, this book presents a selection of essays about modern theologians. The book focuses on the biblical narrative of salvation. Some of the writers included are Reinhold Niebuhr, Dietrich Bonhoeffer, Hans Kung and Wolfhart Pannenberg.

*Door to Revelation: a Narrative Interpretation* by Gabriel Fackre. This book looks at the role of narrative; the telling of the story of Jesus from beginning to the end. Designed for seminarians and scholars.



## Rev. Pam's Bread Recipe



*"Give us this day our daily bread."*

*For a copy of Rev. Pam's sermon on the spirituality of making bread, please contact the office.*

### Ingredients:

- 2 Packages of Dry Yeast
- 2 Cups Lukewarm Milk (scalded)
- 1 Tablespoon of Honey
- 1 Tablespoon of Salt
- ¾ Cup Warm Water
- 3 Tablespoons of Sugar
- 3 Tablespoons of Oil
- 7 to 8 Cups of Flour

**Directions:** Scald the milk and set it aside to cool. Dissolve yeast with honey in warm water in large bowl. Let stand until frothy, about 15 minutes. Stir in milk, sugar, oil and salt. Add 4 cups flour and beat until smooth. Mix in enough of the remaining flour to make dough easy to handle. Knead 10 minutes. Let rise one hour until double in size. Punch down. Divide into 2 or more parts. Shape each piece into a loaf. Place loaves into pans or on baking sheets. Brush with melted butter or beaten egg and let rise 1 hour until double in size. Bake at 425 for 20 to 30 minutes depending on size of loaves.

**Options:** for Egg Bread decrease milk to 1¾ cup and add 2 eggs. For Whole Wheat Bread replace 4 cups of the flour with whole wheat flour and replace the sugar with ¼ cup honey.
